



In 1898, when Dr Christie returned to Formosa with her three young children and Rev. Ferguson, she obtained significant support from the churches in Scotland. This allowed her to give free medicine to the patients and fund the building of her modern hospitals for women and children in Formosa. She didn't want to waste the funders' support.

Therefore, she worked extra hard and eventually fell ill again in 1900.
