

Tâioânjī pán =bô liânjīhû (hyphen) ê Pêhōejī

Tī 1900 (it kiú khòng khòng) nî chápjī goéh, ll̄isapék siansin koh chài khì Báksa Kàuhōe (chitmá Tâioân Kohiōng Lâimñg ê kàuhōe), mā tī kāngsî koh tit tióh Malálíá. ll̄isapék siansin kianchhî beh tiliâu sóu ê hoānchiá liáuāu chiah beh trúkhì Tâilâm. Tī trúkhì ê lō nih, i ê pēnchèng koh khah siongtiōng. Tng i trúglái kàu Tâilâm Sinlâu Pēn̄t̄n ê sî, sóu ê siansin lóng chīnlék kā i itī. Chóngsî, tī sìcháp kang liáuāu, ll̄isapék siansin tī 1901 (it kiú khòng it) nî it goéh chápchhit hit kang, tī Tâilâm Sinlâu Pēn̄t̄n kòesin. Hit tang i saⁿcháp saⁿ hòe.

Chit ê pisiōng ê siausit chin kín tòh thoân chhut khì. Bat hō ll̄isapék siansin tiliâu kòe ê hoānchiá lóng lâi kàu Tâilâm kah i saⁿsî. Sòng Tiongkian bōksu kā siōng simài ê khanchhiú, saⁿ ê gín'á ê bóchhin, anchòng tī Tâilâm siâⁿ Pakmñg êkha ê thióngtōe. Ka saⁿsî ê tūingó t̄ngt̄ngt̄ng, in iānlō tòe tī koaⁿchhâ āupiah, kā Tâilâm chhīkhu that kah móamóamóá.

In December of 1900, Dr Christie got malaria the second time, halfway to visit the church in Baksa (now Lāimñg, Kaohsiung, Taiwan). Dr Christie insisted on seeing all her patients before returning to Tainan. After the trip, her illness worsened. When she arrived in Tainan, the doctors in Sin-Lau Hospital tried to save Dr Christie's life. However, after forty days of battling the notorious tropical diseases, Dr Elizabeth Blackburn Christie passed away at Tainan Sin-Lau Hospital at age 33 on January 17th, 1901.

This sad news quickly spread, and lots of her patients came to say goodbye at her funeral in Tainan, following the coffin to the cemetery. Rev. Ferguson and the three young children buried their beloved wife and mother in the north entrance tower of Tainan, Formosa.
