

## Tâioânjī pán =bô liânjīhû (hyphen) ê Péhōejī

Tī 1900 (it kiú khòng khòng) nī chápjī goéh, līsapék siansi<sup>n</sup> koh chài khì Bák̄sa Kàuhōe (chit má Tâioân Kohiông Lāimng ê kàuhōe), mā tī kāngsī koh tit tiòh Malálá. līsapék siansi<sup>n</sup> kianchhī beh tīliáu sū ē hoānchiá liáuāu chiah beh tṛgkhì Tâilâm. Tī tṛgkhì ē lō̄ nīh, i ē pē<sup>n</sup>chèng koh khah siongtiōng. Tng i tṛglâi kàu Tâilâm Sinlâu Pē<sup>n</sup> ē sī, sū ē siansi<sup>n</sup> lóng chīnlék kā i itī. Chóngsī, tī sīcháp kang liáuāu, līsapék siansi<sup>n</sup> tī 1901 (it kiú khòng it) nī it goéh chápchhit hit kang, tī Tâilâm Sinlâu Pē<sup>n</sup> kòesin. Hit tang i sa<sup>n</sup>cháp sa<sup>n</sup> hòe.

Chit ê pisiong ē siausit chin kín tòh thoân chhut khì. Bat hō̄ līsapék siansi<sup>n</sup> tīliáu kòe ē hoānchiá lóng lâi kàu Tâilâm kah i sa<sup>n</sup>sī. Sòng Tiongkian bóksu kā siōng simài ē khanchhiú, sa<sup>n</sup> ē gín'á ē bóchhin, anchòng tī Tâilâm siā<sup>n</sup> Pakmng ēkha ē thióngtōe. Ka sa<sup>n</sup>sī ē tūingó tngtngtng, in iânlō̄ tòe tī koa<sup>n</sup>chhā āupiah, kā Tâilâm chhīkhu that kah móamómóa.

In December of 1900, Dr Christie got malaria the second time, halfway to visit the church in Baksa (now Lāimng, Kaohsiung, Taiwan). Dr Christie insisted on seeing all her patients before returning to Tainan. After the trip, her illness worsened. When she arrived in Tainan, the doctors in Sin-Lau Hospital tried to save Dr Christie's life. However, after forty days of battling the notorious tropical diseases, Dr Elizabeth Blackburn Christie passed away at Tainan Sin-Lau Hospital at age 33 on January 17th, 1901.

This sad news quickly spread, and lots of her patients came to say goodbye at her funeral in Tainan, following the coffin to the cemetery. Rev. Ferguson and the three young children buried their beloved wife and mother in the north entrance tower of Tainan, Formosa.
